In the process, we learn from a challenge. In effect, he has taught us in a positive way about the capabilities of handicapped people and the often triumphant nature of their lives.

A bad dose of life or some challenges are always the start for a handicapped person like me. For example, walking suffers somewhat as a result of my handicap. Recently, I took a spill and plummeted to the pavement. I didn't hesitate and with some aid got right back up. I believe this incident could inspire a good motto of life for me: when life knocks you down, show what you're



made of and stand tall again. A second point of weakness for me remains my strength. At least I am strong in spirit but not always in body. Hopefully, I can walk in Bowlingate with Mrs. Haury and swim at the Y.M.C.A soon, no doubt, I'll be a gladiator.

The most noticeable handicapped drawback for me is my memory. Indeed, while I may have things in common with an octogenarian, I don't hang with the "Cocoon" or "Driving Miss Daisy" crowd. To me, memory is still a mystery. It comes and goes.

The results of handicap on my life have been a series of take-aways, the most devastating being my college degree – close but no cigar. At least, I'm still an intelligent young man (can't take that away). Of course, in a supremely ironic way, the friendship of my college buddies, the Wahoo girls, has provided its own diploma sorts – a 4.0. Another handicapped result has been the reshaping of my life's plan (no newspaper work for this aspiring journalist in Atlanta or someplace but Nashville is a big town and abundant options await).

Of course, considering handicaps, as always in life good comes from bad. For example, support from friends, family and the Boss (his name is God) has been phenomenal---a ray of light in the dark night. It's wonderful feeling God's mercy also. Despite limitations, I've experienced what seems to me almost boundless achievement. "I'm realistic, but sometimes the people that tell me I can't do something now better beware."

Indeed, it almost seems that it's been my goal to surprise or defy people. Instead of a nursing home life, I have a department store job at Dillard's. Take that! Ultimate blessing and achievement remains the fact that I have encountered my very best friends in my social group for disabled people – Springboard. Without a doubt, they are not just hang-out friends but true friends, Undoubted they make my life brighter. A further supreme aspect of my life as a handicapped person has been tackling the piano again and returning to my musical roots, taking piano classes again. Call me Liberace if you must, but his attire leaves me cold. My piano teacher tells me she is proud of me and that I'm doing a fantastic job. Soon, I will play with a candelabra atop the piano in many moving concerts. I will be in demand. Buy your tickets now.

Through my handicap, life's lesson to me is that change can be beneficial and promote good things. Sometimes you must simply find new ways of doing the same thing and a different perspective on the world altogether. And remember in the end that God tests us for different reasons and I think I aced this handicapped exam.

From my experiences, I pray I am now wiser, more appreciative and loving person. Thank God, with my family and friends we've got a good supportive team. Call us the "Titans".
